Oncor Electric Delivery Company LLC (Oncor) is proposing a new 345 kilovolt (kV) electric transmission line in Taylor, Runnels, Coleman, and Brown counties. The proposed transmission line will be approximately 70 miles long, depending upon the route certificated by the Public Utility Commission of Texas. The proposed transmission line will connect the existing Bluff Creek Switching Station (located approximately 2.25 miles southeast of U.S. Highway 277) in Taylor County to the proposed Brown Switching Station (to be located approximately 0.6 miles south of Ranch Road 586, southwest of Brownwood), in Brown County (see associated map).

Oncor is committed to routing the proposed transmission line in a manner consistent with values of the local communities, the Texas Utilities Code, and the Public Utility Commission of Texas rules and policies. The project has been recommended by the Electric Reliability Council of Texas (ERCOT) to ensure continued safe and reliable electric service in the State in light of increased integration of electric energy generated by wind production facilities. Completion of the project will enable the new transmission system to efficiently move wind-generated power to market and add capacity to the entire system. In support of the routing process, Oncor is holding three identical public open house meetings to solicit input for use in determining the preferred route for the proposed transmission line and to share information about line routing alternatives. PBS&J, a consulting firm retained by Oncor for the project, has identified preliminary alternative transmission line routes for consideration which are shown as dashed lines on the associated map. Ultimately, Oncor will select a preferred route and alternate routing that will be submitted for certification. The Public Utility Commission of Texas will then make a determination on which route, if any, will be constructed. Maps with greater detail will be exhibited at the meeting. Individuals attending these “come and go” open house meetings will have an opportunity to ask questions and provide comments to representatives and technical experts from Oncor and PBS&J regarding the routing of the proposed transmission line. These preliminary alternative routes are subject to modification based on information received at these public meetings and further study. 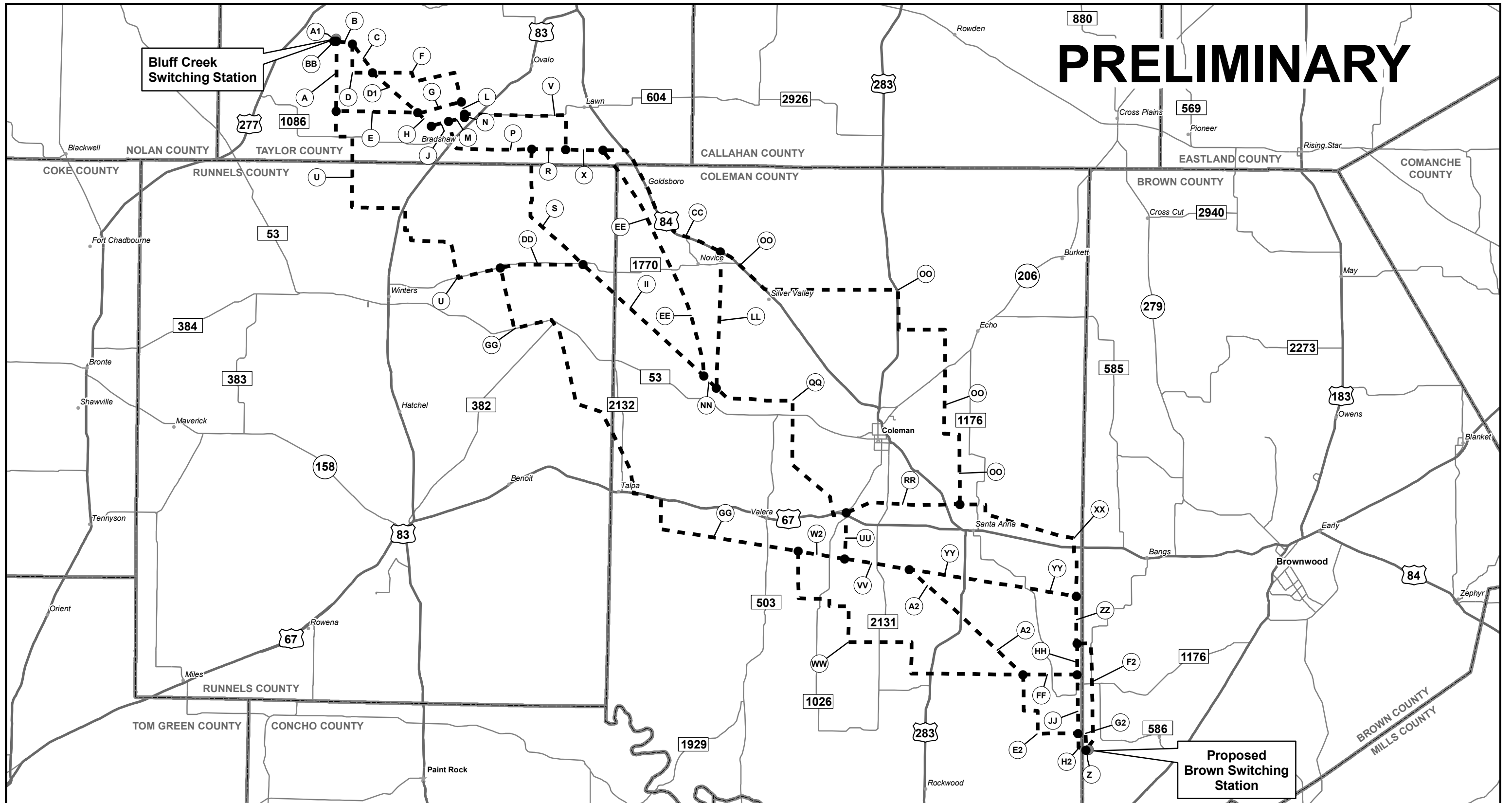





Exhibit 1

**Legend**


